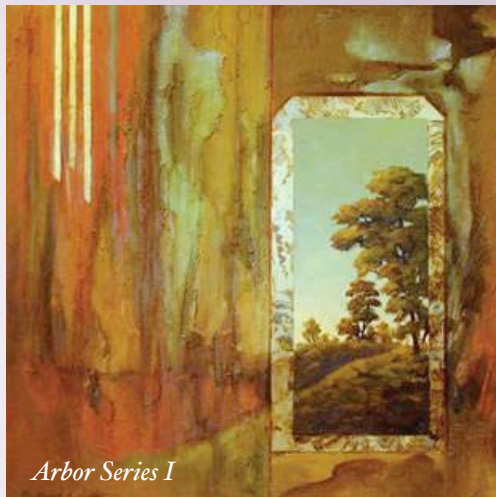


Marlys Mallet

I met Marlys at the Art Expo in Las Vegas and was immediately spellbound by her beautiful abstracts. I'm not easily won over by abstract work but Marlys uses metallic pigments to make the designs 'pop' from the canvas. They are beautiful. Marlys did mention that if you don't want to hang them as shown, you should feel free to hang them as you wish. From the artist's mouth—honest! (See the November Newsletter for images)

There is an additional type of painting that Marlys produces in conjunction with her husband, Michael Redhawk. Michael is a very talented realistic painter while Marlys sticks to the abstract and together they

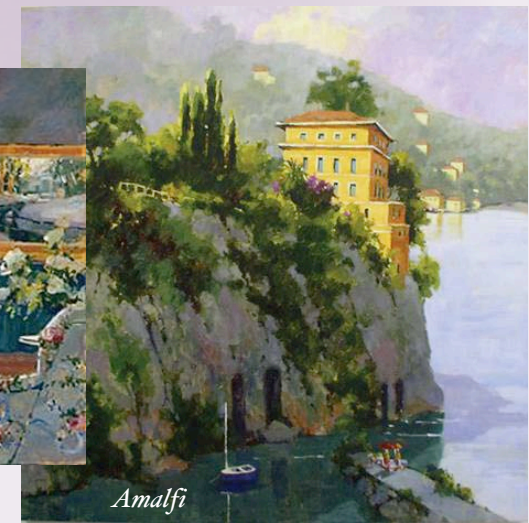


collaborate on what they call a 'unison'. Michael starts the painting with a section of trees and sky landscape and frames it with a metallic window, around which Marlys paints her abstract field with continuation of the colors and the feeling from the landscape. The entire piece is finished off in a 'box' frame that is metallic gold. In sunlight, the piece just sparkles. It is beautiful. While a picture can't do it justice, here it is (*lower left*) for you to get a basic idea. All of the 'Unison' pieces are originals.

Marilyn Simandle

California artist Marilyn Simandle has had a long and successful career. She says, "The paintings we look at affect us in many ways. Some are calm, peaceful and soothing; others are energetic and joyful. They convey these impressions because they combine harmony and diversity to differing degrees. Harmony unifies, diversity excites.

In a way, harmony and diversity are opposites of the same coin. Both should be present in every painting, and the degree to which each dominates and plays against the other helps determine the mood of the painting."
